



View by Object of Expenditure



Cost recovery for extrabudgetary activities






2025 vs. 2024 | Commitments to Extrabudgetary Projects







- Enhance Investment in weather, water and climate services.



Reflection in EC-Ext(2025) Document

THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL:

Having considered, the proposal of the Secretary-General contained in document <u>EC-Ext(2025)/INF. 2(1)</u> and the Operating Plan 2026–2027 contained in document <u>EC-Ext(2025)/INF. 2(2)</u>,

Having further considered the financial situation of WMO at 31 August 2025 as reflected in document Cg-Ext(2025)/INF. 4(2),

Adopts the regular budget for the biennium 2026–2027 of 138 746 200 Swiss francs (CHF) by Appropriation Part as given in Annex 1 to this resolution, noting the resulting transfers between Appropriation Parts are below the 3% threshold defined in Article 4.2 of the Financial Regulations,

Endorses the Secretary-General's proposal for strategic reinvestment of the financial savings from the reorganization as contained in EC-Ext(2025)/INF.2(1) aimed at strengthening support to Members





Reflection in EC-Ext(2025) Document

THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL:

Encourages the Secretary-General to:

- (1) Sustain and strengthen efforts to address ongoing liquidity challenges through cost containment and efficiency measures, including the timing for the initiation of the strategic reinvestments, the prioritization of critical staff recruitment and operational expenditures, and continued restraint in travel-related expenditures; and
- (2) Maintain a strong focus on resource mobilization, and to further expand outreach to non-traditional donors to supplement the Regular Budget.





FINAC Recommendation

Recommendation 3:

That Executive Council adopts draft Resolution 2/1 (EC-Ext(2025)).
