

INFORMATION NOTE FOR PARTICIPANTS

We are pleased to welcome you to Geneva for the Extraordinary Session of the World Meteorological Congress (Cg-Ext.(2025)) from 20 to 23 October 2025, followed by the Extraordinary Session of the Executive Council (EC-Ext.(2025)) on 24 October 2025. The High-Level Segment for the Early Warnings for All (EW4All) event, will take place on the morning of 20 October 2025, after the opening of Cg-Ext.(2025).

Meeting Venues and Access

• WTO – High-Level Segment (20 October morning)

The High-Level Segment for the Early Warnings for All (EW4All) event will take place at Council Room of the World Trade Organization, William Rappard Centre, Rue de Lausanne 154, Geneva. The WTO is located across from WMO Headquarters (approximately 5 minutes on foot). WMO badges will be valid for both buildings on 20 October. WMO staff will guide participants from WMO to WTO during registration hours. Please note that parking at WTO is very limited; public transportation is strongly recommended.

• WMO Headquarters – 20 afternoon to 24 October

The rest of the session will take place at WMO, 7bis Avenue de la Paix, 1211 Geneva, Switzerland, near Place des Nations. The building can be reached by tram, bus or train. The nearest tram stop is Nations (Tram 15) and the nearest train stop is Genève-Sécheron, approximately five minutes from Cornavin station. Access to the premises requires an official conference badge.

Badge Collection

Registration and Badge Collection All delegates, whether attending in person or remotely, must be registered through the Event Registration System (ERS). Permanent Representatives are requested to coordinate the registration of their delegations. Assistance is available at registration@wmo.int.



Badges may be collected at the WMO Headquarters (Ground Floor, Reception Area) during the following hours:

- Friday, 17 October 14:00–17:00 (early badge collection)
- Monday, 20 October 07:00-17:00
- Tuesday-Friday, 21-24 October 08:00-17:00

Each delegate must collect their badge in person, presenting a valid passport or ID. Badges must be scanned at the gate to access the premises.

Badge Collection and Access at WTO (20 October morning)

At the WTO, the High-Level Segment and EW4All event will take place in the Council Room. The following procedures apply:

Heads of State and Ministers

They may proceed directly to the WTO Council Room, without coming to WMO and are not subject to X-ray screening. Delegations must submit the names of principals and accompanying persons, as well as vehicle and driver details, to HLEvent@wmo.int by as soon as possible. Firearms are not permitted, except for one accredited security officer accompanying a Head of State.

Representatives from Permanent Missions

They may use their valid UNOG "D" badge for entry through the standard diplomatic entrance.

Other delegates (including those registered through WMO)

All others must first collect their WMO badge at Headquarters before proceeding to WTO, where standard ID and security screening will apply.

Seating Arrangements

At WMO Headquarters, the plenary (Salle Obasi) has limited capacity. Each Member delegation will be allotted a maximum of two seats in the plenary.

A pass to enter Obasi room will be distributed, in addition to the access badge.

Additional delegates and observers may follow the proceedings from Salle C1 and Salle B, where live streaming will be available. Remote participation will also be possible via Zoom and webcast.

Seating in the plenary will follow the alphabetical order of Members in French, starting with Zambia. The complete seating plan will be displayed at the building entrance.



At the WTO Council Room (20 October morning), there will be no seating limit. Delegates should collect their country nameplate at the entrance and choose a seat within the room.

Members are requested to confirm whether their delegation will participate in person or online, and indicate the number of delegates attending physically, using forms.office.com/e/6TXCHkHZWd.

Tentative Workplan and Working Hours

The session will officially open on Monday, 20 October 2025 at 09:30 Geneva Time.

The tentative working hours are as follows:

- Monday, 20 October: 09:30-12:30 and 15:00-18:00 Geneva time
- Tuesday, 21 October to Thursday, 23 October: 09:00–12:00 and 14:00–17:00 Geneva time.

Working Languages and Interpretation

Simultaneous interpretation will be provided throughout the sessions in the six official languages of the United Nations (Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian, and Spanish). Documents are also be available in these languages on the session website. Portuguese will be passively interpreted during the sessions.

Practical Information about Geneva

Geneva is a global city located at the heart of Europe, renowned for its picturesque setting on the shores of Lake Geneva, surrounded by the Alps and Jura mountains. Known as a hub for international diplomacy, it hosts numerous international organizations, making it a center for global governance and cooperation.

The city boasts a rich history, diverse culture, and offers a high quality of life. With a population of around 200,000, Geneva is a relatively small city, but it has a cosmopolitan atmosphere, with over 40% of residents being non-Swiss nationals. This international flavor is reflected in its wide range of restaurants, cultural events, and institutions.



Geneva is also famous for its beautiful parks, museums, and proximity to outdoor activities, including hiking in the summer and skiing in the winter. The city is safe, walkable, and offers efficient public transportation, making it easy to explore during your stay. We recommend you visit Parc de la Perle du Lac, located 3 minutes' walk from WMO Headquarters, a scenic and tranquil park known for its stunning lake views and beautifully maintained green spaces.

Languages in Geneva

Geneva is a multicultural city where multiple languages are spoken due to its international character and status as a hub for global organizations. The official language of Geneva is French, which is widely used in government, education, and daily life. However, English is also commonly spoken. Additionally, German and Italian, Switzerland's other official languages, are spoken by some residents, reflecting the country's linguistic diversity.

When traveling in French-speaking areas like Geneva, it's useful to know a few basic French words and phrases.

Common greetings include "Bonjour" (hello) and "Bonsoir" (good evening).

To say thank you, you can use "Merci," while "S'il vous plaît" means please.

For polite interactions, "Excusez-moi" (excuse me) is handy when navigating crowded spaces or asking for help.

If you need directions or help, "Où est...?" (Where is...?) followed by a location is useful.

These basics can go a long way in making your travels more comfortable!

Time Zone

Geneva operates on Central European Time (CET), which is UTC +1. During daylight saving time (late March to late October), the city follows Central European Summer Time (CEST), which is UTC +2.

Weather in Geneva

Geneva experiences a temperate climate with significant seasonal variation. Depending on the time of year, you may encounter the following conditions:

Spring (March - May): Temperatures range from 8°C to 15°C. Light rain is common, so packing an umbrella and light jacket is recommended.



Summer (June - August): Warm temperatures between 20°C and 30°C. Light, breathable clothing is advised.

Autumn (September - November): Cooler temperatures from 10°C to 18°C. You'll need a jacket, and expect occasional rain.

Winter (December - February): Cold temperatures from 0°C to 7°C. A heavy coat and warm clothing are essential, as snow is possible.

For the most accurate weather forecast during your stay, we recommend checking online weather services closer to your travel date.

Currency

The official currency of Switzerland is the Swiss Franc (CHF). Major credit and debit cards are widely accepted. ATMs are readily available throughout the city and accept most international cards for cash withdrawals.

As of October 2024, here are the approximate exchange rates for the Swiss Franc (CHF) against major currencies:

USD 1 CHF = 1.1556 USD EUR 1 CHF = 1.068 EUR GBP 1 CHF = 0.769 GBP CAD 1 CHF = 1.378 CAD AUD 1 CHF = 1.495 AUD JPY 1 CHF = 149.9 JPY

Transportation in Geneva

Geneva has an excellent public transport system, operated by Transports Publics Genevois (TPG), which includes buses, trams, and trains. Tickets are to be bought at the ticket machines located at every bus or tram stop in the city and inside the buses going outside of the city. As there are no ticket machines in the city buses, you are supposed to buy your ticket at the station before the vehicle comes.

How to get to the city center from the airport

Train: The easiest and fastest way to get to central Geneva from the airport is by train, which departs from the airport every 12-20 minutes. The journey to Geneva's Cornavin station takes around 7 minutes.



Bus: Several buses also connect the airport to various parts of the city. Bus 5 or 10 can take you to the city center from the airport in about 15-20 minutes.

Taxis: Taxis are available outside the arrivals area and take around 15-20 minutes to reach downtown Geneva, depending on traffic. The fare is usually between CHF 35-45.

WMO Headquarters

Access: The WMO building is located near Place des Nations, and can be accessed by tram, bus, or train. You will be required to present a valid ID at the reception to receive a visitor's badge.

Tram: The nearest tram stop is "Nations" (Tram 15), which is a short walk from WMO. Trams run frequently throughout the day.

Bus: The nearest bus stop is "Genève-Sécheron", 3 minutes' walk from WMO.

Train: The train also connects the Geneva's Cornavin station with Genève-Sécheron station in 5 minutes. The train runs every 15 minutes.

Tax & Tipping

Switzerland has a value-added tax (VAT) on goods and services, which is typically included in prices. Non-EU residents may be eligible for VAT refunds on certain purchases, so keep your receipts. Tipping is not obligatory in Switzerland, as service charges are included in most bills, but rounding up or leaving small change for good service is appreciated.




Emergency Calls

In case of an emergency, dial 112 for general emergencies, 117 for police, 118 for fire, and 144 for medical assistance.

Electricity

Switzerland uses Type C and Type J power sockets. The standard voltage is 230V, with a frequency of 50Hz. Please ensure you have the correct plug adapters for your devices. You can also purchase a WMO adapter at the WMO souvenir shop.



Smoking

Smoking is prohibited in enclosed public spaces, including restaurants, cafes, and public buildings. However, many establishments offer designated outdoor smoking areas.

Visa Information

If you require a visa to enter Switzerland, please ensure that you apply well in advance of your travel date. Participants attending meetings at the WMO in Geneva may need to obtain a Schengen visa, depending on their nationality.
